2 days before your surgery: Date:	Start using the antibacterial wash (see instructions on page 3)

What do I need to do when I arrive?

When you arrive at EMPCC staff will direct you from the main building reception to the surgery day case unit (SDCU) reception. You will be signed in here and wait for a member of staff to collect you. Family/friends are not allowed on to the ward. You can keep your mobile phone with you before and after your procedure. This will let you stay in contact with family/friends. You will stay on SDCU for the whole of your stay, unless you need Post-Op care. If that is the case you will go to our Post-Op ward (0116 502 1434). In both cases once discharged you can be picked up from SDCU reception.

What to bring

- Please bring **all** medications you are taking (prescribed and non-prescribed) in the green bag provided.
- Dressing gown or similar.
- Slippers or suitable shoes.
- Phone/ reading book/ magazine.
- Sanitary towels (regular or night sized towel).
- Glasses case/ hearing aid case/ denture case - where applicable.

What do I need to do before the surgery?

- If you are a smoker it is recommended that you stop **3 months** before your surgery. If you are not able to do this you should aim to reduce the amount you smoke as soon as possible, in the lead up to your surgery.
- **You must stop alcohol and smoking completely 24 hours before your surgery and after your surgery.**
- Do not use any body lotion, cream or perfume.
- Do not wear any make-up.
- Remove jewellery and piercings.
- Remove all nail varnish, including clear polish, acrylics and shellac.
- Please use headphones/ earphones for all audio devices/ phones, and not the loud speaker
- A member of staff will transfer your personal belongings securely to your recovery ward.
- The trust will not accept liability in the respect of any lost or damaged property or belongings
- **For diabetic patients on insulin and/ or tablets - once admitted, if at any time you feel faint, dizzy, or think you are having a 'hypo' please let staff know right away.**

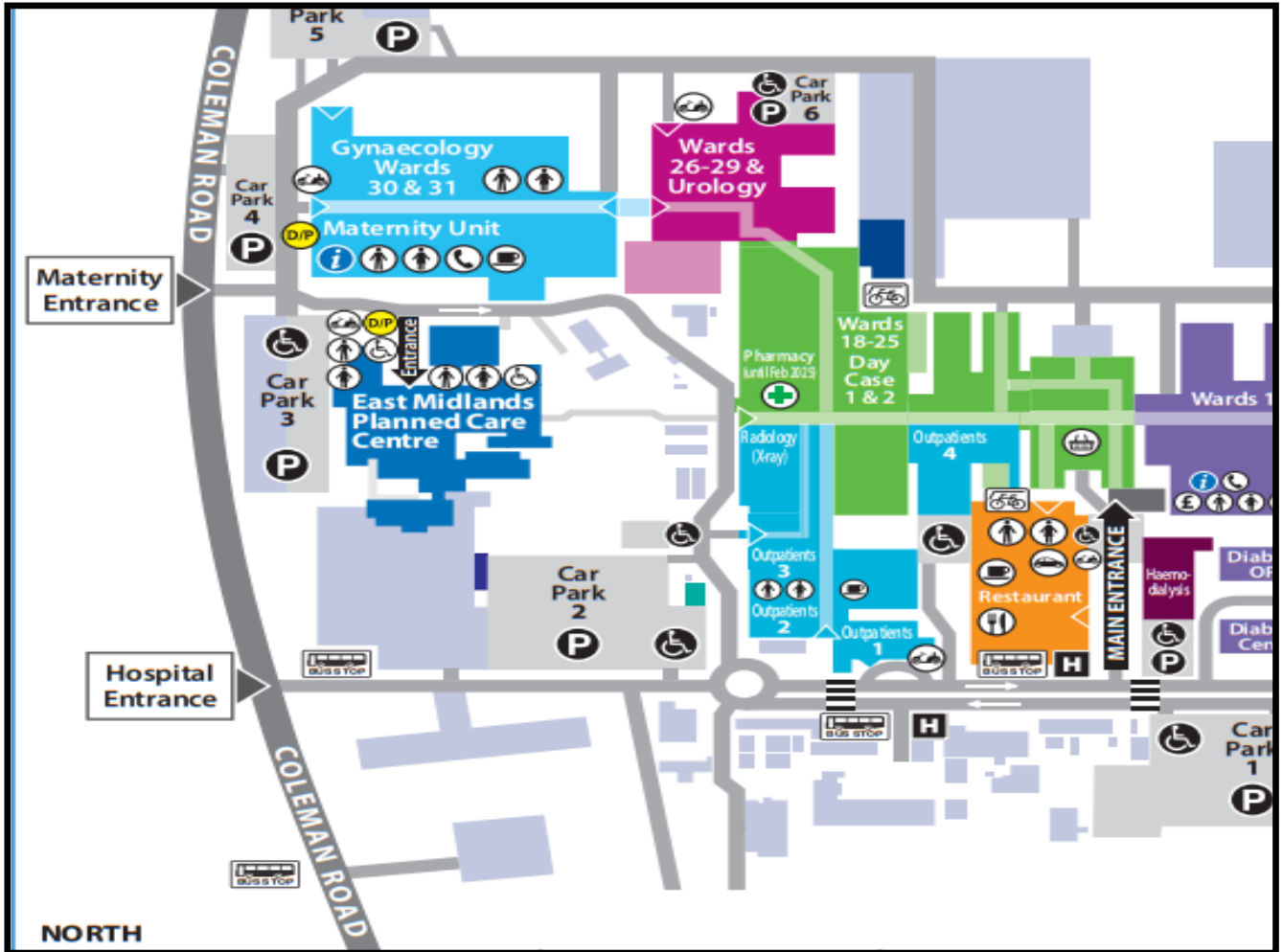
Using antibacterial wash

- To reduce your risk of infection during your hospital stay all patients are given an antibacterial soap to wash with. This soap helps to reduce the amount of germs on your skin.
- You need to start using this 2 days before your surgery. You need to use it on the day of surgery. You need to use it every day while in hospital.
- Apply the antibacterial wash directly onto wet hair and skin. Use a new or disposable cloth. This will prevent the spread of germs. Do not dilute with water. It will not be effective.
- As a pre-wash, rub the antibacterial wash all over your body. Use it in skin creases such as the under arms, groin, fingers and toes. Leave it on your skin for at least 30 seconds before rinsing.
- Wash your hair with the antibacterial wash once before your admission. You can use your normal wash products, shampoo and conditioner after you have used the antibacterial wash, if you wish. Finally dry yourself with a clean towel.

When attending for a surgical day case appointment, please follow signs to waiting area or speak to one of the team in the main entrance.

East Midlands Planned Care Centre (EMPCC), Colman Road entrance. Building is next to Maternity. The closest car park is 3. When you enter EMPCC you will see the main reception, a member of staff will direct you to the surgical day case unit SDCU.
