

# Advice after loop diathermy treatment to the cervix

## Introduction

You have received treatment on your cervix (the neck of the womb), called **loop diathermy** treatment. You needed this treatment following the abnormal smear test which caused your referral to the hospital.

## What is loop diathermy?


This treatment uses an electric current to remove abnormal cells from your cervix. A local anaesthetic is used to numb your cervix, and the abnormal cells are then lifted off the cervix using a wire loop. (Lletz wire) (see diagram on page 2).

The examination and treatment last approximately 15 minutes. When the treatment has finished your be given a sanitary pad (you may want to bring your own) and asked to rest for a short while before going home.

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## Advice after loop diathermy

After this treatment, you may have blood-stained vaginal discharge, which can last up to four weeks. This is normal.

- You may have some period-like cramps as the anaesthetic wears off. Take your usual painkillers to relieve this discomfort.
- Do not use tampons for four weeks following this procedure (even if you have a period). Please use sanitary pads instead.
- You should not have intercourse for four weeks following treatment. This is to ensure that the area that has been treated can heal properly.
- Do not go swimming or have a bath for two to four weeks to help prevent infection.
- Your first period after the treatment may be heavier than usual.
- Avoid heavy lifting and strenuous exercise for four weeks to reduce the risk of bleeding.

If you have any heavy bleeding, which is not like a normal period, or if you have an offensive, smelly vaginal discharge, please contact your GP. Your GP will refer you back to the hospital for advice as necessary.

# Follow-up

We will inform both you and your GP of your results. If we are discharging you from our care, you will require a cervical smear and human papillomavirus (HPV) test at your GP surgery six months after your loop diathermy. If you are coming back for another colposcopy examination at the hospital (together with a smear and HPV test), an appointment for the Colposcopy Clinic will be enclosed with your results letter.

How we follow you up after this will depend on the results of your six month tests.
