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# Inflation of your expandable breast implant

#### What is an expandable implant?

As part of your breast reconstruction surgery you have an expandable implant. The aim of having this type of implant is to inflate the implant slowly to stretch the skin over a period of weeks until the reconstructed breast is the same size or slightly larger than your other breast.

#### When will the implant be inflated?

You will be seen in the breast care out-patients department to check your wound. Depending on how well your wound has healed, you will be given an appointment to attend the clinic so that expansion of your implant can be started. This will usually be about one month after your operation. This appointment can be with the doctor or Nurse Practitioner.

#### How is the implant inflated?

The doctor or nurse practitioner will explain the procedure to you. You will then be asked to lie in a position that is comfortable for you. A sterile solution of saline (salt water) will be injected slowly into the port (valve) of your expander. You should not find this painful but may feel a tightening sensation of the skin over the implant. A small dressing will be placed over the port following inflation. This can be removed the following day.

### How often will I have the implant inflated?

You will be given an appointment on either a weekly or two weekly basis, depending on how comfortable you are following expansion, your doctor will talk to you about this.

The number of weeks that you need to attend will depend on the size of the implant. When your expandable implant is fully inflated your doctor will discuss with you any further procedures that may be needed.
